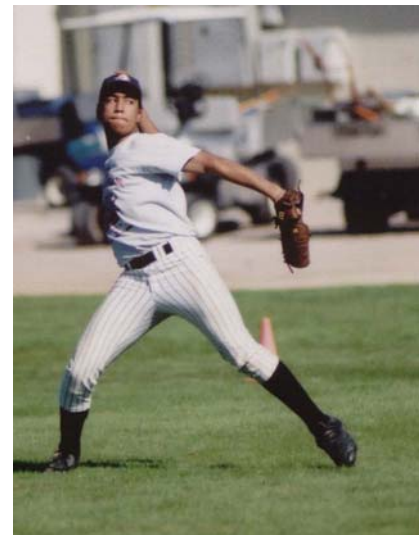
Baseball Factory's Spring Training Camp offers high school players:

Tentative Itinerary to Include:	<p>Day 1: Players arrive at Greenville-Spartanburg Int’l Airport or Charlotte Int’l Airport between 5 – 7 PM, check in, coach/player introductions (optional afternoon workout for players that arrive early)</p> <p>Day 2: On-field instruction, hitting/fielding drills, infield/outfield, pitcher fielding practice, position specific training, game situations</p> <p>Day 3: On-field instruction, live batting practice, pitcher bullpen sessions, intense small group training, game play/game situations, players depart from Greenville-Spartanburg Int’l or Charlotte Int’l Airport between 6 – 8 PM</p>

As Senior VP of Baseball Operations, he oversees all Baseball Factory events and instruction. Steve currently serves as an Associate Scout with the Colorado Rockies.
